Curriculum News — Autumn 2016 Topic: Journeys

English

As part of our English and topic work the children will be writing:

- Information about their journey to school
- Instructions for the Green Cross Code
- Stories and descriptions based on We're going on a Bear Hunt and The Three Billy Goat Gruff
- Poems about journeys into space Each week the children will have a focused group guided reading session with a member of staff.

Science

The children will be learning about and exploring **human senses** this term. They will be identifying and naming different body parts linked to each sense, observing and classifying, gathering data and performing simple tests.

Suggestions to support learning at home Remember a little and often is the most effective way to learn!

- Ideally, read with and to your child on a daily basis
- Check the weekly maths and phonic homelearning sheets to support your child's learning at home
- Look at your child's red sentence book each week and practise any tricky words or sounds which they are finding difficult

Messages

- Please, please label <u>all</u> clothes, shoes, trainers, water bottles and book bags
- Please personalise the handle of your child's book bag with a ribbon or small charm so they can find it easily in the box
- Book bags need to be brought to school daily. Please do not put water bottles in the bags in case they leak.

Maths

The children will be taught skills in:

- Counting forwards and backwards in 1s, 2s, 5s and 1os
- Place value
- Calculation methods involving all 4 operations
- Shape, position and pattern work
- Measurement using standard measures, money and time
- Fractions
- Data handling
- Mental skills and recall of doubles, halves, bonds to 10 and 20 and the 2x, 5 x and 10x multiplication

Foundation subjects

Geography: The children will discuss holiday journeys and the journeys we make to school. We will be looking at road safety features in our local area and carrying out a traffic survey.

History: As part of our topic on journeys, the children will be learning about Neil Armstrong and his voyage to the moon.

Art: The children will make texture collages and consider how different print effects can be achieved. They will make junk model vehicles and create a class picture of The Three Billy Goats Gruff.

DT: This term the children will be looking at pop-up pictures and books and then designing a pop-up card.

RE: Our first topic will be Family and Friends. This will be followed by learning about journeys in the Christmas story.

Music: The children will be focusing on contrasts: loud/quiet, high/low, smooth/jumpy, and fast/slow. They will also experience beat, rhythm and pitch.

PSHE: We will be discussing our school rules and values and thinking of ways we can ensure the classroom is a happy, safe and fair learning community for all.

PE: In games we will be developing ball skills. In gymnastics they will be travelling in a variety of ways and creating different shapes and balances. The children will respond to music, stories and poems in dance.

ICT: The children will be programming floor robots and developing their keyboard and mouse skills.
